Programme Outline

The MSc Clinical Science (Reconstructive Science) programme is a 3-year part time Masters that provides all of the academic content required for the Reconstructive Science Scientist Training Programme (STP).

Block release

Each module is structured into blocks of teaching in order to be incorporated alongside the professional workplace training.

Timetable

The table opposite shows the content and timetable for the programme which is delivered jointly by Manchester Metropolitan University (MMU) and King's College London (King's). Year 1 contains generic and introductory content and has been scheduled to take place from **Monday 1 October until Friday 9 November 2018**. The first 3 weeks of this initial block will take place at MMU and the remaining 3 weeks will take place at King's.

Year 1

6 week block: 1 October to 9 November 2018
[3 weeks at MMU / 3 weeks at King's]

- Integrating Studies in Reconstructive Science
- Introduction to Reconstructive Science

Year 2

[2 weeks at MMU (Sep&Nov) / 1 week at King's (Nov)]

- Medical Devices and research methods in Reconstructive Science [Research Methods will take place in September with the specialist unit being taught in a 2-week block in November]
- Research Project

Year 3

[2 weeks at King's (Jan/Feb) / 1 week at MMU (Jan)]

- Prosthetic Rehabilitation [Dates to be confirmed - 3 weeks in January/February]
- Research Project

Support

The programme is managed by Dr Keith Winwood, Programme Director (MMU) and Dr Trevor Coward, Programme Director (King's). You will be allocated a personal advisor who provides pastoral care and mentoring.

Travel and Transport

All teaching will take place on the main campuses of MMU and King's. These are both situated in close proximity to the city centre and are within easy reach of main rail, motorway and airport links.

Accommodation

University accommodation is scarce during the first semester so you will probably require private accommodation during your first year. MAHSE have a special rate with Atrium Apartments - further details about this and King's accommodation in London are available on the MAHSE portal. Access to the MAHSE portal will be given to all new trainees.
