# **Programme Outline**

The MSc Clinical Science (Clinical Pharmaceutical Science) programme is a 3-year part time Masters that provides all of the academic content required for the Clinical Pharmaceutical Science Scientist Training Programme (STP). The degree is awarded by the University of Manchester although some modules are taught by King's College London and the University of Salford.

#### **Block release**

Each module is structured into blocks of teaching so that it can be taught alongside the professional workplace training.

#### **Timetable**

The table opposite shows the content and timetable for the Clinical Pharmaceutical Science programme. Year 1 contains generic and introductory content and teaching will be delivered in short blocks shown in the table opposite. Teaching takes place in Manchester, except the December block which will take place in London (KCL).

Years 2 and 3 contain more specialist, pathway specific modules.
